This degree will allow you to develop the skills and knowledge needed to create curriculum, training materials, advocacy campaigns, and communicate content in a variety of settings. Our program provides students with a practical international experience, multicultural training, and is considered a national leader in multiculturalism and multicultural education. The Agricultural Education courseload will help you become an agriculture advocate equipped with more than 200 hours of educating experience and a license in agricultural education.

Students will choose from three focus areas:

Agricultural Industrial Education

focuses on the training industry within corporate agriculture companies

Agricultural Service and Advocacy Education focuses on building public support and/or global service toward an agricultural need

Agricultural Teacher Education (ATE)

focuses on 5th to 12th grade teacher certification in agricultural science education

HIGHLIGHTED COURSES

Many of our students obtain a minor in the College of Agriculture, Food and Environment because our program requires over 60 hours of coursework in various agricultural subject areas including animal science, plant science, economics and agriculture mechanics.

AED 362: Field Experiences in **Career and Technical** Education

Students gain supervised experiences in schools and other agencies through observations, participation, field trips, inspection of programs, and professional organizations.

AED 580: Foundations of **Teaching Career and Technical Education**

This course is a multicultural approach on the foundation of understanding the educator and the consumer of information being delivered in order for cultural autonomy to be gained.

AED 586: Methods of Teaching Career and Technical Education

Students work towards developing educating competencies with emphasis on discussion, demonstration, problem-solving, cooperative learning, service learning methods.
